

will help you with the meaning of names, when sometimes other concordances will just tell you who a person was, or where a city was, without giving the definition of the name of the person or city.

There are some other tools that are very nice to have, although not mandatory:

- 3. The Book of Joshua (Christadelphian Expositor)
- 4. Joshua His Life and Times, by John Ullman
- 5. Joshua, by Maurice Beale
- 6. Christadelphian Works Bible software

# WE HOPE TO BE AMONG THOSE PEOPLE!!!!!

In your studies, you will soon see that the *main point* of the book of *Joshua* is that "*Yahweh Saves*."

The best way to begin your study - any study is to read what God says.

Read the Bible. The more the better.

We highly recommend you begin by reading the story of the man Joshua. It doesn't take all that long, and it will really help you to understand the order of the story of Joshua's

life. Read it as you would a story book. Maybe your friends or

your parents can read it aloud with you.



Getting Started:

As you may know, the Old Testament was written in Hebrew.

This man would have been known by his **HEBREW** name, and called

"Үеноѕниа."

Since we speak English, we translate his name to **ENGLISH**, and call him "Joshua."

In the New Testament times they spoke Greek, and in GREEK his name would be "Jesus."

They're the same name! God's son was given the same name as this man Joshua that we're going to be studying.

As you go through your studies, keep an eye open for ways that

Joshua was like Jesus.

We call this a 'type.' In many ways, Joshua was a type of Jesus Christ.

A great way to do this is by incorporating the reading of it into your daily Bible Readings. We will be looking at Exodus 17; Numbers 13,14; Deuteronomy 31:1-23 and Joshua 1-12; 23-24.

### Have fun. Keep studying!



Once you've read through Joshua's life, begin your study. Since this workbook will take you more than one sitting to finish, we've divided the study up into chapters.

At the beginning of each section there is chapter or section of verses to read and a summary.

Even though you've already read through the story of the life of Joshua, re-read the chapter, and carefully read the summary before you answer the questions.


This will make answering the questions a lot easier.

Don't try to take a shortcut and try to answer the questions without reading the Bible. You'll find it's not much of a shortcut after all, and more importantly,

you will not get as much out of your study, which is the reason for doing this workbook in the first place!

### Where do we start?



The story of the life of Joshua is recorded throughout four books of the Bible. Let's begin this study by taking a look at the life of this courageous man as a whole to get the big picture before we look more deeply into his actions.



- 1. Start by reading **Exodus 17**, where we're first introduced to this man Joshua. What is the first thing we're told that Joshua is commanded to do?\_\_\_\_\_
- 2. Then read **Numbers 13 & 14**, where you will read that Joshua is one of the men chosen to spy out the promised land. Moses uses 12 men to spy out the land. One man from each tribe. Which tribe is Joshua from? (hint: his name is different in this chapter but his father's name is Nun, so that gives us a clue)
- 3. Then, in **Deuteronomy 31:1-23**, you'll see that Moses is old, and going to pass the leadership of the people on to Joshua. He calls Joshua in front of all of the Israelites, and what does he tell Joshua that he must do?



The book that bears Joshua's name is, of course, what we'll be looking at the most.

4. In **Joshua 1–5**, we read of Joshua leading the Israelites into the land that Yahweh had promised to them. Where is the first place the LORD tells Joshua to go once Moses is dead?

5. **Joshua 6-12** is where we're shown how he leads them in conquering the wicked nations that are in the land. What is the first city they took?

In <u>Joshua 13-22</u> we read of Israel moving into the land and occupying the places God has assigned to each tribe, but we won't be looking at those chapters because in this study, we're concentrating on the man Joshua, not on Israel's land.

6. In **Joshua 23–24** we read of Joshua's final speech to the nation of Israel, after they've conquered the land, encouraging them to keep ahold of the land that was given to them, reminding them of all that Yahweh had done for them, and telling them to forget all the world had to offer and to serve God. We also read of his death. How old was Joshua when he died?

In this workbook, you will be looking up words in the The Strong's Concordance, and marking things in the margins of your Bible.

When looking words up, you will see a box like this one, with:

►Joshua ►Strong's #3091 ►yahowshuwa ►" Yahweh Saves "

- + the English word
- the Strong's number
- ► how to pronounce the Hebrew word,
- the meaning of the Hebrew word.

Sometimes, some of the chart will be filled out for you, just fill in the blanks

This is all very important for us to know, since God wrote His

Word in Hebrew (or Greek in the New Testament) and many times our English translations just don't quite have the same meanings

When you find out something interesting, it's important to write it in your Bible, so you <u>remember</u> it. After all, that's the whole reason for studying God's Word in the first place! When you mark your Bible, underline the word you are referring to, (in this case, <u>Joshua</u>) and then write the word and the meaning in your margin, as shown.→

# JOSHUA DEFEATS THE AMALEKITES

Yahweh will have war with the enemies of the truth from generation to generation.

#### Read Exodus 17

It had only been about a month since God had defeated Egypt with the last plague, and the children of Israel had been delivered from slavery in Egypt. The Israelites were on their way to the land that Yahweh had promised them, when they were attacked by a cruel and vicious nation of people who lived in the wilderness, called the Amalekites.

The Amalekites followed behind the Israelites and attacked and killed the people that were in the back of the group; those that were weaker and could not travel as quickly. Moses immediately called a man named JOSHUA to choose out men to fight in this very important battle. Not only was this the first time that the nation of Israel was attacked, this is also the first time that we see Joshua mentioned in the Bible.

The name Joshua is a Hebrew name that means "Yahweh saves." The same name in the Greek language is "Jesus". As we will see, Joshua is a type of Jesus: he did many things that are just like things that Jesus has done or will do when he returns. This was the first time the Amalekites attacked, but from here on they appear time and time again fighting with Israel. The Amalekites represent the enemies of God and His people. We can see the type here can't we? Just as we see Joshua attempting to defeat the Amalekites in this chapter, Jesus will defeat all of the enemies of the truth when he returns and sets up God's kingdom.



# THE PEOPLE THAT DWELL IN THE LAND ARE MIGHTY

NUMBERS 13814 Deuter Sofformy 1:22-26

Do we trust in God enough to give up the pleasures of this life?

These two chapters are two of the saddest chapters in the Bible. As the Israelites prepared to enter Canaan, the Promised Land, Moses said to them, "Behold, Yahweh thy God hath set the land before thee: go up and possess it as Yahweh, the God of thy fathers hath said unto thee; fear not, neither be discouraged."

Unfortunately they did fear and they were very discouraged.

The nations in Canaan were much stronger than they were and their cities had huge walls around them. Many of the Israelites thought that they would be killed if they tried to take the land. They thought this because they did not believe in God enough, they thought that they would die fighting the Canaanites. To them, the risk was much greater than the reward. As a result

they would wander in the wilderness for forty years, and most of them would die there.

It is easy for us to make the same mistake. If we do not *really* believe that there is a kingdom coming and that Christ is going to return, we will not be willing to give up the pleasures of this life. But if we believe like Joshua and Caleb, we will be willing to give up this life by fighting sin in our lives. It will be clear to us that it is totally worth it to give up this life for eternal life in the kingdom.



# YAHWEH CHOOSES JOSHUA TO TAKE OVER FOR MOSES

DEUTERONOMY 31:1-23

We will follow Jesus into the Kingdom.

### Read Deuteronomy 31:1-23

**Thirty-eight years** had now passed since the Israelites had followed the faithless advice of the ten spies.

**Moses had been** Israel's leader for the last 40 years. By God's hand Moses had delivered the people from cruel slavery in Egypt, given them God's precious laws, and brought them right up to the edge of the land that their God had promised to them. But Moses' job was about to come to an end. Moses was not the man that God had chosen to lead Israel over the Jordan River and finally into the land of Canaan, the Promised Land. That job would belong to Joshua: but he would not have to do it alone. Joshua is reminded over and over in this chapter that Yahweh his God would be with him.

**Just like Joshua**, the Israelites had to learn this lesson. We must also learn that we will only enter the kingdom through the strength of our God. And our Joshua, Jesus Christ, will be the one to lead us there, but only if we follow him.


#### Read Joshua 1

As the leader of Israel, Joshua's first job was to help the new generation of Israelites to avoid making the same mistakes that their parents had made. Their parents had been weak and faithless, but Israel now had to be "strong and of a good courage." The Israelites were about to fight against many nations that were stronger than them. They were about to fight against the same people that had terrified their parents. You may have noticed that God emphasized that Joshua had to obey God's commands.

**We find it** difficult to do what our God has commanded us to do. We know what we want to do but it's much easier to do things the way we think is best than to do them God's way. To fight against this we need to be strong in our faith, and have courage to be different from others.

**How was Joshua** to get this strength and courage? Joshua was told, "This book of the law shall not depart out of thy mouth". God told him that if he meditated on God's word day and night he would have success. *The same is true for us!* We should make sure to be *so familiar* with the Bible that it will not leave our minds, or depart out of our mouths: what we say will be what the Bible says.

We must read the Bible every day to be strong and courageous.

# ISRAEL'S FAITH IS MULTIPLIED T H R O U G H RAHAB'S FAITH

**JOSHUA 2** 

We can make our faith stronger by reading about the faith of others.

#### Read Joshua 2

When Yahweh promised the land to Abraham, He told him that his descendants would have to wait for 4 generations before entering it. He told him that the reason for this was "because the iniquity of the Amorites was not yet full." This means that at that time there were still some people living in the land of Canaan that were believers in Him, and He wanted to make sure they had a chance. This is also shown when Yahweh was going to destroy Sodom: He sent angels to save those that believed in Him. Here, it is shown with Rahab who was saved from being destroyed in Jericho, because of her faith. Rahab proves that she has tremendous faith in God. Rahab's faith towered above the faith of the Israelites. She had obviously done her best to find out everything she could about the God of the Israelites. She knew that the God of Israel was

# CROSSING THE JORDAN

Christ was given immortality before we will be

#### Read Joshua 3

The Jordan River was a very difficult river to cross. It was especially hard at the time of year when the water was high, flowing very fast, and flooding over the river banks. This is the time of the year when Joshua needed to get across. Not only did Joshua have to get himself to the other side, but he had to get an entire nation across it! The lesson we learn from the Jordan River itself is an amazing one. The name 'Jordan' means 'descending'. It is a good name for the river because it flows down, down, down, and it ends at the lowest point on the entire earth! The lowest point on the earth is the Dead Sea. The water of the Jordan River begins north of Israel, falls over 27 rapids and winds back and forth like a snake as it flows from the Sea of Galilee down to the Dead Sea. This acts like a parable of our lives that teaches us a lesson. **The lesson we** need to see in the Jordan River is that we, like the Jordan River, are also winding through life, descending down to death. Our lives have their ups and downs, they go this way and that way, but without Christ there is no hope for us: every one of us, from Adam to now, is descending to death. The miracle of the turning back of the Jordan River shows that Christ has made it possible for us to be saved from death. Let's see how.

We are reminded that some will be in the Kingdom, and some will not.

#### Read Joshua 4

**From the middle** of the Jordan River, 12 men took 12 stones. They were set up on the other side of the river, so that the people would always see them and remember the great miracle of Israel crossing the Jordan on dry land. The LORD wants us to think about and to meditate on the things that He says and does. Some people would also understand that it pointed forward to a savior that would come; Jesus Christ.

The 12 stones that were taken out of the Jordan River represent the faithful men and women of Israel. They were to be a new nation when they came up from the Jordan River, just as we are to be new men and women when we come up from baptism. Joshua himself took another 12 stones and placed them in the middle of the Jordan River. These 12 stones were covered by the water when the river began flowing again. These stones represent the men and women of Israel that died in the wilderness: the faithless that didn't put their trust in Yahweh. They represent the part of us that we must leave behind in the waters of baptism when we choose to lead a new life in Yahweh's service.

**We see two** sets of 12 stones in this chapter. The first set leaves the water and enters into the land, and the other set descends to death. It is up to us to remember how Israel crossed the Jordan and to choose whether we will enter the kingdom through Christ, or be left in the waters descending to death.

# CIRCUMCISION AND PASSOVER AT GILGAL

After our flesh is cut off, we will be able to eat the Passover with Christ.

#### Read Joshua 5

Our flesh, which just means the desires that we all have, wants to do what it wants to do. Following God is not what 'the flesh' wants to do: look at the people in the world all around us, they don't feel like serving God, so they don't! Circumcision was a symbol of the cutting off of that flesh; it was Israel's way of telling God they wanted to do things God's way, and not their own way. It is a symbol for us, too, of replacing our ways with God's ways. The circumcision of the Israelites at Gilgal was a token of their desire to put God first in their lives.

**Circumcision also** points forward to another lesson for us; the change of our bodies that will happen to those people that are going to be in God's kingdom. They will have their bodies changed from bodies of flesh, like we have now, to bodies that will live forever. It was only after their circumcision that the Israelites were ready to celebrate the Passover Feast. In just the same way, it is only after our bodies have been changed to immortal bodies, that we will celebrate the great Passover Feast with Christ in the kingdom.

Achan, in his sin, became accursed because he was a hindrance for Israel.

### Read Joshua 8


**We are shown** once again in this chapter that victory doesn't come by anything we do, but by the strength of our God. After the death of Achan, Yahweh's strength was again with the Israelites. They defeated the city of Ai and pressed on to the place that Moses had commanded Joshua to go to. That place was called **Shechem**.

**Shechem** is located in a narrow valley between two mountains; **Mount Ebal** and **Mount Gerizim**. God had told the people that Mount Ebal was to be a sign for them, so that they would always remember the curses that would come upon Israel if they disobeyed God. Mount Gerizim was to be a symbol of the blessings that would come if they obeyed Him. As they came to this place, they would be reminded that the only way that Yahweh would give them victory was if they obeyed Him. To the Israelites, Shechem was a place of decision. It was a place that represented the decisions that we all have to make in our lives. Will we use our time and energy to serve Yahweh or will we use it to serve ourselves?



### Read Joshua 9

When the Gibeonites came to Gilgal, Joshua and the leaders of Israel made a big mistake. They "asked not counsel at the mouth of the LORD". In other words, they did what they thought was right, but didn't ask God. They thought they knew what God would want them to do so they did it. Relying on their own way of thinking was a very easy mistake for them to make. It was probably out of kindness that Joshua made peace with the Gibeonites. They seemed to be good people, they seemed to believe in God, and they seemed to be a lot like Rahab. But they were not. They tricked Joshua and the people into disobeying the commands of Yahweh. It is just as easy for us to do the same thing. We have all been told what God wants us to do, but very often we think that we know a better or simpler way, and so we do things our way. How can we ask counsel of Yahweh today though? The counsel of Yahweh is found throughout the Bible, so keep reading God's word.

The scene was <u>amazing</u>. Picture this: Yahweh slew the Canaanites with a great slaughter at Gibeon and then chased after the survivors. While the survivors were fleeing, Yahweh caused great hailstones to rain down upon them and even more died. But the Israelites needed more time to fully destroy their enemies, and it was getting dark, so Joshua commanded the sun and the moon to stand still. Yahweh listened to Joshua and the sun stood still for a whole day, making that day twice as long. The Canaanites, who worshipped the sun and the moon, must have been longing for night so that they could escape. But night never came for them. Yahweh was far greater than their gods: He controlled the sun and the moon.







**Joshua realized** that his life was almost over, so he called for the leaders of Israel to all come together at Shechem, the place of decision. Yahweh had given them all that He promised He would and Israel was now in control of the land. Joshua called upon each tribe and family to put away all of the ways of the Canaanites and to serve Yahweh only. Unfortunately many of the Israelites went on to live their lives just as the Canaanites did. They became just like the Canaanites: they served their gods and forgot about Yahweh.

**The lesson** for us is clear: If we want to be in the Kingdom of God we must put the ways of the world out of our lives. We must be careful not to become like people in the world around us who waste their time on useless things that can lead us away from our God. Instead we should be servants of Yahweh. Joshua said to Israel, "Choose you this day whom ye will serve...as for me and my house, we will serve Yahweh."
